How to Grade Papers and Assignments When Homeschooling

Include informal writing about the assignment before the final paper is due (see "In-class Writing Activities" for suggestions). Conference with students: If time, see each student individually to help them develop and revise their paper. Make your key contribution here; put a grade and only minimal comments on the final paper.

Grading Written Assignments

Look for a rubric that grades papers on a scale of 1-10, or carries a total of 100 points. If you can't find one (and good base-10 rubrics can be hard to find), make one. You can do this by modifying an existing rubric to a different point scale. Or you could make a new rubric from scratch.

Unfortunately, there are limits to how much time a teacher can spend grading papers, writing notes, and encouraging students. For example, each day, students often complete warm-ups, sponge activities, or some other pre-lesson assignment while the teacher takes roll and sets up for the day's lesson.

Creative Ways to Grade and Provide Feedback for Students ...

Spreadsheets - Many instructors use spreadsheets (e.g. Excel) to keep track of student grades. A spreadsheet program can automate most or all of the calculations you might need to perform to compute student grades. A grading spreadsheet can also reveal informative patterns in student grades.

Ask students to write papers twice. Students submit the first draft and you provide constructive criticism on both content and style. Students then revise the paper and you grade the second draft, assigning a grade based on a scoring rubric you have previously discussed with students. Return assignments within a reasonable amount of time.

The time it takes to grade student papers is the chief reason for our dislike of the chore. How can you make marking student writing more time effective? Walvoord and Anderson in *Effective Grading: A Tool for Learning and Assessment in College* (2010) directly address this concern.

Read and grade the papers. I use a stylus to mark up my students' papers, because I like to be able to draw arrows and circle things. I even use the stylus to scrawl short comments as needed. If the comment is larger, I can use the text tool. You can grade in as many different colours as you want, and adjust the pen width and style, an added ...

At the top of students' papers, write the subject area and grade for each, e.g., 'Rdng- B, Sci- A'. Collect grades from several workbook pages at a time. This is a useful strategy for grading assignments in workbooks when children aren't supposed to rip the pages out.

It is important to help students to focus on the learning process rather than on "getting the grade," while at the same time acknowledging the importance that grades hold for students. Stagger due dates. Plan in advance and have students in different sections turn in essays on different dates. Break it down. Determine an optimum number of papers to grade at one sitting. Take a break for an hour before starting another session. Schedule grading time. Literally. Put it on your calendar. Have a realistic return policy.

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
